Corinth

If anyone speaks in a tongue, two—or at the most three—should speak, one at a time, and someone must interpret.

1 Cor. 14:23

If there is no interpreter, the speaker should keep quiet in the church and speak to himself and to God. If anyone speaks in a tongue, two—or at the most three...and someone must interpret. 1Cor. 14:27-28

What then shall we say, brothers and sisters? When you come together, each of you has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation. Everything must be done so that the church may be built up. 1 Cor. 14:26

So if the whole church comes together and everyone speaks in tongues, and inquirers or unbelievers come in, will they not say that you are out of your mind? 1 Cor. 14:23
