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# **Class Support:**

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Class Description: Few twentieth-century theologians have left a global legacy to the Christian witness like that of Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Here we study the life, martyrdom and writing of a disciple who embodied so many of the highest ideals of true discipleship. A disciple knows that Christian grace is a costly grace. A disciple knows that the call of Christ includes sharp, loving obedience. A disciple knows that to walk faithfully with Christ in the here and know, a world crippled by the fall, requires sacrificial action, sometimes sacrificial action unto death. A disciple knows that life with God is communal, not only with the triune God, but also with God's people within context of the watching world. Bonhoeffer willingly and joyfully engaged in the dismantling of the Third Reich, including an assassination plot against Hitler. Throughout the final four weeks of this course we will study what Bonhoeffer learned about Christian Ethics.

#### Structure of Class:

## Part 1 (30-45 mins): Teaching

Each participant will sign in to our all-class 30-45 minute video call using the video conference platform, Go2Meeting. This is where the main teaching is delivered each week. Check your email for unique login credentials <u>every week</u>.

#### Part 2 (20-30 mins): Small Group Discussion

Immediately following the all-class connection and teaching (Part 1), each participant signs off of the all-class call and joins their small group in a new video call for small group discussion, prayer and fellowship. A leader for each small group is identified to lead this time. Small groups are responsible to lead and manage their own small group video call.

## Information for Small Group Facilitators:

Thank you for volunteering to lead your small group! As the small group facilitator, you establish your own separate video call. Although you can choose your own parameters, the assumption is that most groups will meet for 20-30 minutes immediately after the all-class video call ends. You will be provided with a list of discussion questions prior to each session.

**Step 1:** Determine what platform you prefer to use to facilitate your small group time together.

**Step 2:** Create a group email thread using the information Ina provides you with. Send an initial email greeting to your group. In this email, recommend your platform of choice and ask the group if everyone is comfortable using that platform. Confirm the platform, time, duration and frequency.

**Step 3:** Lead the successful launch and facilitation of your small group week-to-week (this can mean simply identifying a sub for any evening you need to miss).
