The Things We Carry: Leah and the Burden of Not Being Wanted

For Wednesday's class, we will be looking at Leah, a biblical character who should get more attention than she does. We will be looking at how she handled rejection, but we will also consider the larger issue of bearing the burden of disappointment and unmet expectations.

Text: Genesis 29-31 (Or if your time is limited, Gen 29: 15-30:24)

- 4. How would you describe Leah's progression in handling her disappointment and rejection?
- 5. What in this story speaks to your own experiences of disappointment?
